

Sixth Form Programme of Study

Students in our Sixth Form will usually study 3 subjects at A Level, choosing from over 20 subjects. All A Level courses run over 2 years and are examined at the end of the course. For some students it may be appropriate to study a fourth A Level subject, and those wishing to study Further Maths must choose 4 A Levels.

Students may also choose to study an elective, non-A-Level qualification which they will usually complete during year 12. The elective subjects on offer are AS in Further Maths, the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) or Core Mathematics. Each of these courses offers UCAS points towards university entry and develops a broader range of skills for those who opt in.

In addition to their A Level courses, all students will follow a PSHE programme aimed at developing the skills needed to be a successful student and develop a deeper understanding of the world around them. This programme has been designed with the students to equip them for life after Sixth Form.

Our timetable operates over a twoweek cycle. Most A-Level subjects are allocated ten hours per cycle of lesson time. PSHE sessions are allocated one hour per cycle for all students, with some students spending some additional time with their tutor when necessary.

This means that all students have a number of periods on their timetable when they are not in lessons. Our dedicated Sixth Form centre, well-resourced library and other learning areas provide the ideal location for students to study and learn independently.

Student Support

We offer first class support to students within our Sixth Form. At the start of Year 12 each student will be allocated a form tutor who will be their first point of contact. Tutors will meet with students on a regular basis and carefully monitor their progress.

Alongside the tutor, the Pastoral Team and Academic Leaders monitor the

progress of all students carefully to make sure that any issues are quickly identified and resolved. The support offered to students is wide ranging and dependent on need, from study skills support or intervention sessions for those with academic issues, to in school support or referral to external services such as the school nurse or counsellor for those with pastoral concerns.

All students also have access to our excellent in-house careers team who help students to prepare themselves thoroughly for whatever career they aspire to. All students in Year 12 will have a one to one guidance interview, and in Year 13 students are given personalised guidance and support as they apply for university, apprenticeship or employment.



The Pathway Programme

All Sixth Form Students at Heckmondwike Grammar School have the opportunity to follow career-focused pathways as part of our careers programme.

Each pathway will provide students with a range of career-specific information and additional opportunities during their time in our Sixth Form.

The aim of the pathway programme is to give students access to additional support, guidance and experiences that will help them achieve their future goals and ambitions.

Oxbridge Pathway

PATHWAY LEADER Mrs Stone

The Oxbridge pathway is intended to support students who aspire to attend Oxford or Cambridge University.

Medical Sciences Pathway

- Support in accessing work experience placements.
- Access to talks and presentations from pathway specific visiting guest speakers.
- → Support in preparing for interviews from industry specialists.

STEM Pathway

Student Leadership

Sixth Form students at Heckmondwike Grammar have a wide range of opportunities to develop their skills outside the classroom. Our Sixth Form is an integral part of the school community, with students acting as positive role models for students in the main school.

The Sixth Form Senior Committee, led by the Head Students, play a leading role in shaping the school, with representatives contributing to all aspects of school life. Students can also take up opportunities to become prefects, subject ambassadors or peer mentors.

Students are encouraged to participate in, or create, societies allowing them to develop leadership and communication skills as well as enriching the Sixth Form experience for all students. In recent years, students have led activities from Anthropology to Yoga, including the highly successful Medicine Society (MedSoc) the Law Society.

Financial Support

The student bursary fund aims to help and support students enrolled in the school Sixth Form who face the greatest barriers to learning, and to ensure that students can fully participate in and benefit from the 16-19 curriculum provision. The application form can be found on our school website, along with full details of the eligibility criteria.

Students in the Sixth Form who are eligible for the bursary may receive support with the costs of travelling to school, subsidised meals in school and provision of specialist equipment needed to access lessons. We may also be able to assist with the costs of educational visits and university visits.

We are also able to support students in applying to a number of charitable organisations who provide funding to support the education of different groups of students.

Enrichment List

Our comprehensive Sixth Form enrichment programme provides further opportunities to develop new skills, volunteer at local charities and explore personal interests.

We understand that universities, apprenticeships and potential employers are looking for more than just grades, which is why we ask all Sixth Form students to take part in at least one hour of enrichment per week.

Students are also welcome to carry out their own enrichment activities in any non-contact period. Students can complete any activity that has a beneficial impact on their professional development ie. volunteering/sports.

Some of the enrichment activities currently on offer are:

BOARD GAMES - develop your strategic thinking and play!

BADMINTON / CIRCUITS

CIVIL RIGHTS FILM - educate yourself on civil rights and film through watching and discussing.

CREATIVE WRITING - student-led sessions on developing your writing.

CHESS - Play face to face and share your chess skills. Whether you are a beginner or a Grandmaster, you are welcome. Equipment will be provided.

CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY - after building your knowledge of clinical psychology and mental health, you will design a service to improve mental health provision in the local area. This enrichment will be enjoyable for anyone interested in mental health, psychology, medical care, medicine, business and finance.

LAW SOCIETY - the Law society aims to bring together like-minded students who are interested in a career in Law and to boost their student experience and employability. You will learn about the court structure, discuss legal and moral issues surrounding cases brought to court and review the effectiveness of the prison system.

FOOTBALL - ESFA Competitions

JEWELLERY MAKING - design and make high quality jewellery whilst developing your manual dexterity skills.

RUNNING - cross country and road.

CURRENT AFFAIRS - discuss the news and it's discourse.

RADIO HGS - you make the radio station happen!

STUDENT NEWSPAPER 'WHAT THE HECK?' - Are you into journalism, creating writing, research, illustration, general puzzle creation? If so, being on the 'What the Heck?' team may be for you. 'What the Heck?' is more than

just a student newspaper. This is an opportunity for students to express ideas, write, illustrate or create media that excites.

PARALLEL HISTORIES - an exciting way to study history which is still contested, controversial & relevant.
