## Dear Parent/Carer

As we approach the end of our first half-term, I'm delighted to report, we have had a fantastic start to the year. Our new students in Year 7 and Year 12 have very quickly got into the swing of things and are now enjoying the fast-paced learning environment we pride ourselves on. Indeed, all our students have thrown themselves in to the demands of an academic curriculum and are progressing at a rapid rate.
